“ There are a million memories that come to mind when I think of Pap. Although I don’t remember much when I was a baby, my mom told me all the times he took care of me and sat on the ground and played with me for hours on end. If I wasn’t being held by my dad, I was being held by Pap. He helped raise me into the person I am today. As I got older, I always loved having fun at our annual Kennywood trips we took, all the times we went fishing at lake, and the 4th of July Pirates game where we sat at the “all you can eat” section. Every year, we went to gram & paps house for holidays, and I just remember being so excited to celebrate. We would play bingo for hours on end, watch a movie or sports game, and stuff our face with so much food & dessert. I’ll also never forget the countless sports games that he sat through. Whether it was basketball, softball, soccer, or cross country meets. He was always making everyone laugh in the stands, cracking jokes, or yelling at the coaches (aka my dad). Ironically, I hated running, and Pap drove a far distance to come and watch me but I didn’t run because I was sick. I was upset he came all that way but he pulled me aside and told me “it’s not the end of the world and it will be okay.” He always knew how to make me feel better. I also remember how he sat through all of my dance recitals even when he said he couldn’t make it because it was “Flag Day.” Every year the recital came around, it always happened to be “Flag Day.” Even if he slept through most of it, he was always there. I can’t remember a time in my life that Pap wasn’t there for me. He was cheering me on from my preschool graduation all the way to my college graduation. He supported me every step of the way. I got to show him around the apartment I lived at after college and we had a nice party on Memorial Day to celebrate. He was with me the day I found out I passed the NCLEX to become a nurse. The smile on his face was unforgettable. He was so happy for me. One of our more recent memories was at the pumpkin patch during the fall. I remember we sipped on hot cider, ate popcorn, and enjoyed the fresh air. Our latest tradition was walking around a different mall every weekend & getting dinner. He was always screaming his order so loudly (for no reason) and it would have us in tears. Over the past year I got to sit

and eat lunch with Pap while he was in the hospital. He always got excited when I visited because I would sneak him candied grapes, chips, or some pastry (which he shouldn't have been having) but it made him happy, so I did it anyways. We had great conversations whether it was about the news, sports, or just life events. It was just us two. I held his hand and told him it was gonna be okay. He sat and listened to me and never complained about anything. He just wanted to hear about how I was doing. The nurses would tell me that they fought over who was gonna take care of him because he brightened everyone's day. He was the most selfless person in the world. After 8.5 years of cancer and being in pain, he still managed to make other people feel good. That's the type of person he was. I told him that he was the reason I wanted to become a nurse in the first place and how I will continue to be the best nurse (and person) possible because of him. I know he's watching me from Heaven and sending me all his love. He is the greatest person I have gotten to know in my life, he's my hero. I will miss him everyday and think back on all of our memories forever. It's your time to rest easy & be pain free. Love you so much Pap. ❤️
