Donald E. Bailey, 97, of West Mifflin, Allegheny County, PA passed away on December 31, 2024. He was born in Washington Township, Indiana County, PA on August 13, 1927. Don is survived by his longtime partner of 52 years and many nieces and nephews and their descendants. Don was preceded in death by his parents, Naaman Alexander Bailey and Zelota (Lottie) K. McGregor; his four sisters, Mildred R. Orr, Mabel V. Peterman, Ernestine M. Schmidt and Katherine Fleming; his two brothers, Kenneth J. Bailey and Daniel A. Bailey; and several nieces and nephews, including Paul Orr who lived with his grandparents. Don enlisted in the army during World War II prior to graduating high school. While in the army he served in Nuremberg during the German war crimes trials. He was honorably discharged in 1947 as a Sergeant. He later graduated from Indiana High School with the class of 1948. Don was employed by USS Fabrication, American Bridge, a subsidiary of the United States Steel Corporation, in Ambridge, PA for 37 years, from 1952 to 1989. Don was a member of AA for 39 years. 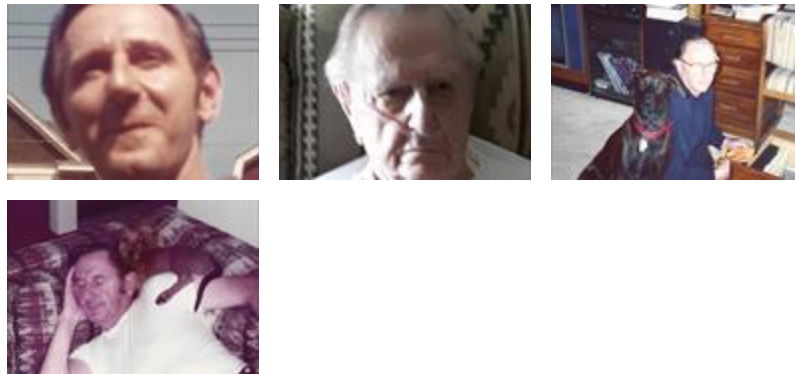
