Stanley A. Smith, age 86 of Pleasant Hills, PA died Thursday January 8, 2015 at his home with his loving family by his side. He was born June 21, 1928 in Snowden Twp., PA, a son of John and Barbara Evanisky Smith. In addition to his parents Stan was preceded in death by his wife of 65 years, Marjorie Noble Smith who died January 11, 2014, brothers: John and Joseph Smith and sister Agnes Dolinar. Chiefs of Police Association, Borough and Township Police Association. He was a graduate of the F.B.I. National Academy and the Pennsylvania State Police Academy.
